The installation of new windows in phase 1 of works at St Fintan's has yielded significant energy savings to date, with further larger savings to come in the next phase. Alongside previous completed projects and behavioural changes, the road to decarbonisation is well underway.

- Significant future cost and energy savings now ensured, with 120 windows installed so far.
- Thermal envelope of building one step closer to decarbonisation alongside other upgrades, and this could be an enabler for a future renewable heating system.
 Consumption savings already seen.
- Heritage building, so there was significant challenges related to period and statutory protections.
- Along with energy related improvements; vastly improved aesthetics for patients, staff and visitors have been noted. PVC frame windows were not in line with Victorian stonework finish.
